

STAYING CONNECTED

In the Scriptures, God reveals the purpose for His Church by using several illustrations. The Church is a bride, a family, a temple, and a body. The picture of a body demonstrates the importance of connection (Rom 12:3-5; 1 Cor 12:12-27; Eph 4:15-16; Col 1:18). Although each body part has its unique function, it cannot survive in isolation. A healthy body must have all its parts connected and working together in unity. This is why Hebrews 10:25 instructs us not to forsake the regular gatherings of the local church. We assemble in order to “stir up love and good works” (Heb 12:24) and to “exhort one another” (Heb 12:25).



Our current situation presents some challenges to our Christian duty to connect with each other. We are being told to "self isolate," which is the direct opposite of behaving as a unified body. I know I will greatly miss our times of worship and fellowship on Sundays and other times. We will need to be more creative in connecting with others without meeting in the same room.

In an effort to stay connected, we will send out a weekly newsletter each Friday. It will be emailed and posted on Facebook and our website. We will also broadcast a worship service each Sunday with congregational singing, Scripture readings, prayers, and a sermon. I realize that these options are insufficient, but they will allow us to connect in a limited way. I urge you to take time each week to connect with other believers by a phone call or message. "Self isolation" may be a good thing to prevent the spread of this contagious virus, but it is not good for Christ's church. Let's do our best to reach out to others in the ways that we can.
