ANTICIPATING HEAVEN

Every believer looks forward to the day when their faith becomes sight in that throng of heavenly voices praising God. What such a gathering will be like is something we can hardly even imagine. now living here in Alberta. Another person came to Canada as a young person from Europe around the time of the second World War after escaping the ravages of that terrible conflict. I talked with a man who has lived in western Canada all his life who God graciously freed from alcoholism thirty years ago. These people and many more are part of the Meadowlands church family who you and I worship with each Sunday. I want to encourage you to look around this Sunday during our worship service and catch a small glimpse of what heaven will be like. You probably won't see very many white robes or palm branches. But as God's people proclaim their praises altogether, may it give you "a foretaste of glory divine" as we anticipate praising God for all eternity!

A few months ago Pam began occasionally having problems swallowing. In June it got to the point where we decided she should get it looked at. She went to the medical clinic in the town I grew up in and they referred her to a specialist. He determined quickly that she needed to have an endoscopy done to see what was going on. There were no appointments available until September but he did not want to wait that long and double booked her for the morning of August 2nd. Following the procedure the doctor came in with the news that the problem is a 5cm mass growing in her esophagus and that it appears to be malignant. He was able to take several biopsies and have sent them to pathology. They also were able to send her to have a CT scan done the same day and are scheduling her an appointment with a thoracic surgeon as soon as possible,

The pastor here preached yesterday about no matter what difficulties we face each day, it does not change the truth that we are to love and serve the Lord with all of our heart and life. Our first reaction with this news was fear and sadness, but the Lord quickly calmed our hearts and gave us an afternoon of worship and praise for the Lord in our lives. This afternoon the Lord took me to Isaiah 24 where He



gives the description of the destruction of the land and the effects it had on everyone, including the people of God. And the instruction for God's people is to respond by glorifying the Lord! Isaiah 24:15 Wherefore glorify ye the LORD in the fires, even the name of the LORD God of Israel in the isles of the sea.

The Lord has been so good to Pam and I. He brought us here (Missouri) to care for her mom as she battles kidney cancer and with that has us in a place where Pam can receive the care she needs much faster than in the Far North. Please praise the Lord with us for all He has done and pray for healing and wisdom.

Hi friends! Eliza is headed into surgery for her final abdominal closure this Wednesday, August 11. We have spent the past few weeks meeting with the general surgeon (same one who did her surgery at birth), plastic surgeon, and anesthesiologist getting all the final checks and info we need. We are so thankful for how the Lord has provided such skilled professionals! We are also aware that this is not a procedure they do often, if ever, so we really want to ask God for WISDOM for docs and SAFETY for little Eliza during the surgery. Recovery is expected to be pretty rough, so we are also asking our God of all comfort to give HIS COMFORT to Eliza while she heals. The plan is for her to be in hospital a week to ten days, if all goes as planned.

We are so aware of how much a difference your prayers have made in her little life (and ours) over the past 2 years. We are so thankful! Pray for the surgery, recovery, comfort for Eliza, and that we would be lights for Jesus and have our eyes lifted to see how we can love and serve those around us in the hospital.
